Dear Benedictine Parents and Guardians,

Thank you for your continued investment in your son's development to prepare him to be the future leader of his family, businesses and communities. We value your choice of Benedictine as the right partner to prepare your son for attending college and starting a meaningful career. Knowing that a significant investment such as this requires planning, I would like to share that the Benedictine High School Board of Trustees has approved a 4.6 percent increase in tuition for the 2018-19 school year.

This tuition of \$11,400 allows us to have the best possible faculty, continually improving programs that deliver the mission and opportunities for your son to grow. We will continue to provide an efficient and affordable education for your son. Tuition covers only about 60% of the cost of a Benedictine education with the additional contributions that make up the difference coming from those that donate their time and money to support our young men's development. This includes the monks and staff that donate part of their salary back to the school and the financial gifts from our alumni, families and friends to annual gifts, to our Blue and White Gala and to the Birthday Bucks raffle.

We are pleased that our tuition also includes value-added programs for your son's education. Among them is our College Ready & Career Bound curriculum, which adds learning from career professionals to our teaching professionals in the disciplines of Engineering, Medicine, and Business-Entrepreneurship. These programs will have specific classes and professional lectures available next school year. Your son also may be able to access college courses taught on campus that can involve state funding. Both programs will help guide his career selection and can increase interest by colleges.

Tuition assistance is available for families with financial need. To request financial need, completing the online FACTS form before April 15, 2018 is required. Consistent with our commitment to help more students afford a Benedictine education, we will assess the need relative to available Benedictine financial aid.
