Dear Benedictine Parents and Guardians,

Thank you for your continued investment in your son's development to prepare him to be the future leader of his family, businesses and communities. We value your choice of Benedictine to partner with you to prepare your son for college and starting a meaningful career. Knowing that a significant investment such as this requires planning, I would like to share that the Benedictine High School Board of Trustees has approved a 4.4 percent increase in tuition for the 2019-20 school year.

This tuition of \$11,900 allows us to have the best possible faculty, continually improving programs that deliver the mission and opportunities for your son to grow. We will continue to provide an efficient and affordable education for your son. Tuition covers only about 67% of the cost of a Benedictine education with the additional contributions that make up the difference coming from those that donate their time and money to support our young men's development. This includes the financial gifts from our alumni, families and friends to our Annual Fund and to our Blue and White Gala, the monks and staff who donate part of their salary back to the school and to the Birthday Bucks raffle.

We are pleased that our tuition includes value-added programs for your son's education. For example, your son has access to college courses taught on campus that can involve state funding. Those college credits may translate into lower college costs or accelerated academic programs for your son. There is also our College Ready & Career Bound curriculum, which adds career professionals to the learning environment in the disciplines of Engineering, Medicine, Entrepreneurship and Media. These programs also add targeted new classes. We also offer access to the many sports, extra-curricular activities and clubs.

Tuition assistance is available for families with financial need. To request financial assistance, completing the online FACTS form before April 15, 2019 is required. Consistent with our commitment to help more students afford a Benedictine education, we will assess the need relative to available Benedictine financial aid.
