

BENEDICTINE HIGH SCHOOL NAMES FORMER DELL TECHNOLOGIES EXECUTIVE AS NEW SCHOOL PRESIDENT

David Schroeder brings nearly 30 years of executive experience to drive new goals

CLEVELAND – Benedictine High School, through Abbot Gary Hoover, O.S.B., its Membership Committee and Board of Trustees, has named former Dell Technologies executive and Benedictine Class of 1990 alum David Schroeder as the school's new president. The announcement follows an exhaustive nationwide search for a leader well positioned to drive the nearly 100-year-old school into the next century of transformative education.

Schroeder most recently served as senior vice president for Dell, where he worked for nearly six years. While there, he grew his department by more than 500 percent. Prior to that, Schroeder served as vice president for the Palo Alto, Calif. technology firm, VMware, where he played a key role in the new company's \$7-billion growth.

"David brings a level of business acumen that is often missed in educational settings," said Benedictine board president, Joseph Sweeney. "This is an unprecedented opportunity to move the school to the next level while preserving our cherished traditions and Benedictine charism."

With the recent completion of a \$6-million expansion project, which includes a new science wing, entrance and courtyard, the school is set to update its strategic plan. Schroeder said he will use this opportunity to significantly advance educational rigor, admissions and advancement while enhancing the campus experience and providing spiritual focus for our diverse student body.

"The best schools in the world today are heavily focused on new and advanced technologies," Schroeder said. "With



this fresh start and my background, we have an opportunity to create some very special things here that will position our current and future young men for enormous success."

David and his wife, Kathy, live in North Royalton, Ohio. They belong to St. Collette Catholic Church and have two grown daughters.

Cleveland. The school's role as a Catholic educational community is to model, educate and challenge each student to become a part of the tradition and spirit of St. Benedict. Behind the Scenes with Dave Schroeder '90

What does it mean to be named the President of Benedictine High School?

Honestly, it is hard to put into words. There are so many emotions that I am experiencing right now, but honored and proud top the list. To return to the place that I called home for four years is incredibly special and the opportunity to continue building on our momentum is so exciting.

Can you share a little background of your experience at Benedictine? Who were some of the influential people or experiences during your time as a student?

I tell people all of the time that my high school years were some of the best in my life. From the first day of freshman football practice to graduation, there were so many special moments that shaped who I am today. I think about Coach O'Shaughnessy, Coach Russ and Coach Thamann who gave me an opportunity to compete on the field. Mr. Francioli without question made learning entertaining. Memories of Fr. Joachim's ceramic class always makes me smile and finally, Fr. Dominic's stoic, disciplined leadership will always stay with me. Of course I have to say that without Abbot Gary's sociology class I might still be a lost soul.

How did you get involved in the tech industry? What has the last 30 years looked like for you professionally?

I've always been interested in understanding how things work I guess. My sophomore year in college I took a programming class and declared MIS as my major, partially because I saw that starting salaries for this degree were above average and I knew that I needed to pay off my student loans. I was incredibly fortunate to work for some of the best companies along my journey and have

incredible mentors who believed in me. Hard to believe it's been 30 years.

What's your vision for Benedictine?

I would say that it is still in development but I can tell you that I want to continue the momentum we have with our new Howley Science Wing, courtyard and school entrance. I want to enhance our educational offerings by integrating more entrepreneurial and technologyrelated courses as well as experiment with offering opportunities for students to learn the trades. We have a special anniversary around the corner and setting up the next 100 years of Benedictine tradition is my top priority. Stay tuned for more on this one.

What are you most excited about in this role?

For me it's always been about seeing others who I've been fortunate to lead have

success and grow. Here at Benedictine if you look at our young talent like Chris, Dom, Brians (times 3), Mike, etc. how can I not be excited about contributing to their growth and success? Add on top of that the kids and all the positive energy we have right now, I mean it's hard to contain how excited I am.


Why Benedictine? And, why now?



CELEBRATING ABBOT GARY HOOVER'S, OSB 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF ORDINATION

This year's Abbey Benefit fittingly is dedicated to our Abbot Gary Hoover, OSB, who is celebrating his 40th anniversary as a priest having been ordained by Bishop Edward Pevec, along with our Fr. Kenneth Katricak, OSB, on April 29, 1983 in Saint Benedict's Church. Born in Cleveland in 1956, Abbot Gary grew up in Garfield Heights as the son of Ray and Dorothy Hoover. He has one brother, Mark, sister-in-law Kris, niece Jenny (Brendan, husband), nephew David, and two great-nephews Benjamin and Henry. Abbot Gary attended Elmwood Elementary School and graduated from Benedictine High School in 1974. He professed vows as a Benedictine monk in 1977 and was ordained a priest in 1983. He taught sociology and served as the school and athletic team chaplain. He was named prior of the abbey in 2008 and was elected the seventh abbot of St. Andrew Abbey in 2014.

Known for his genial personality and Marian spirituality, Abbot Gary has touched many lives in his four decades of priestly ministry through high school retreats and through his weekend pastoral assistance especially at St. Ambrose and St. Colette's Parishes in Brunswick. Ad Multos Annos!


New Venue Continues Old Tradition:




TRACK










Class of 1964

Noah Schrader received his master's degree in Theology and Integrative, Pastoral,


